

How It All Began

On March 6, 1966, The Methodist Church of Jupiter-Tequesta was organized and chartered with 20 families on the roll. Rev. John Simon was the pastor. The dream for a Methodist Church in Jupiter began with five families. It became a reality in 1965 with the Rev. Clark S. Reed, pastor of Juno Beach Methodist Church, conducting the worship for the new mission at the Vogel Funeral Chapel on Highway I. In June 1965 arrangements were made to use Salhaven Auditorium for future services. The Church of Good Shepherd and the United Presbyterian Church in Tequesta were used for choir practice and social events. Wilbur Parker became the first full-time appointed pastor in 1967. Five acres of land on Indiantown Road (present site) was secured for \$35,000. A Sanctuary (present Chapel) and office/classroom space were built in 1969.
