

MEET OUR NEW PASTOR REVEREND SUSAN GRAY



Rev. Susan Gray grew up in the small community of Rush County, IN. Her early faith was nurtured by her mother who worked as a community health nurse to support the family after the death of her husband. Susan

and her three brothers learned much about God's love, overcoming life's challenges, and focusing on faith rather than fear from their mother.

Susan and her husband, Mike, met in typical Indiana "Hoosier" fashion - at a basketball game! They married in 1980 and soon thereafter moved to Teaneck, NJ. Susan returned to college, completing a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education at Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Susan has been invited by Bishop Ken Carter to serve on the Board of Ordained Ministry for the next guadrennium, and she will be participating in the Marcy Preaching Fellowship for 2016-2017.

Rev. Susan now, with great joy, moves to First United Methodist Church of Jupiter-Tequesta as our lead pastor. Rev. Susan, Mike, and their three adult children—Kinsey, Courtney, and Brad—love Florida! Their children have moved across the United States in advancing their educations and careers and remain very close with their parents and each other. Rev.
