FROM OUR PASTOR:



The Consignment sale is over and October is here. There are several events and activities taking place this month that I want to highlight. On October 4, we kick off our 2016 Stewardship Campaign. Please take time to read over the flyer and brochure you will receive. Also, let us pray for God's guidance as we fill out our pledge cards for 2016. We will have a special service on Sunday October 25 for all of us to put our best foot forward in our giving to God for next year. If anyone would like to turn in his or her commitment in early, you may drop your envelop into the offering plate, drop boxes in the hallway, or come by the church office to see Ken Richardson or Michelle Seibert. Our theme this year is "One Heart, One Spirit, One Voice to Praise You, We are the Body of Christ. Join in this exciting adventure.

On Sunday, October 4th, Maggie Donaldson will be sharing in a ministry moment with us during each of the services. In addition, this Sunday is World Communion Sunday, which is one of six church wide Special Sundays with offerings of The United Methodist Church. The money given provides World Communion Scholarships, the Ethnic Scholarship Program and the Ethnic In-Service Training Program. At least 50% of the money collected is for ministries outside the US. 35% of the gifts go for the Ethnic Scholarship Program, while 15% goes for Ethnic In-Service Training.

On Sunday, October 18, the Bells will be playing at the two traditional services. Also, the Stewardship Committee will be sharing a skit with us at each of the services. Of course, it uses humor to make us laugh while we think about its warm and inviting message.

And finally, Sunday, October 25 is our Stewardship Commitment Day. Our prayer is that we would have everyone participate by turning in a card. Let's see what God can do through us. The Council on Stewards will meet at 2:00 in the gym, and then on Wednesday, October 28 in the sanctuary we will have our Charge Conference at 6:00 PM.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

I remember well, as a child, walking into church each week with my parents. I knew what the next two hours held in store for me, and it wasn't always something fun. I knew I would sit on hard chairs and be expected to sit quietly and listen as my Sunday School teacher told us the Bible story for the week. She used the current favorite "visual aide" called flannel-graph so there was always the outside chance I would be allowed to help place the flannel-graph characters on the board to help illustrate the story. But that was only if I had been one of the good kids who sat quietly.

Then I would spend another hour sitting in big church with my parents. I loved the singing and the greeting time and the offering basket coming by always offered some distraction as I tried to see how much the other fathers put in. Then it was listening to the wah-wah-wah-wah-wah of the pastor's sermon. Words too big for my little concrete mind to wrap itself around became the droning backdrop to coloring in all the "O's" on the bulletin.

It may sound like I hated church as a kid, but I actually loved going. It wasn't the events that filled me with such excitement—it was the people. There was a palpable feeling of love that I always felt from the adults who greeted me, taught me and cared for me. Whether it was the nursery ladies, my Sunday School teachers or the pastor who shook my hand after service every week, I knew I was loved, cared about and prayed for.

Each week children enter our Sunday School rooms here at HFUMC with expectations, too. They are expecting to be loved and to learn something new and exciting. Kids are wired to find these two components in their environments, and that's what makes it so exciting to be a part of each child's faith journey. Emotions bring a "stickiness factor" to learning and so children remember more when they participate in something that has some emotion connected to what they are learning. The best emotion for that learning environment is one of love, and we have an over-abundance of that in our Children's Ministry classrooms. From the Childcare workers, to the Shepherds, to our Youth Helpers and those who pray for our ministry, our children are blessed with many who love them.

Here are some other great tips for how children learn academically, spiritually, at school, at church and at home:

- ◆ **Kids learn best when they are actively engaged.**
- ◆ **Lecture is one of the least effective ways to engage students. If students get actively engaged in a text, the text can do its work on the students.**
- ◆ **The rule of thumb of "one minute of attention span for every year of life" seems to work (*12 year olds need to change activities or methods every 12 minutes*).**
- ◆ **Some insights are only gained while laughing.**
- ◆ **Teachers need to speak to a variety of different learning styles in each session as each child is wired for learning differently**

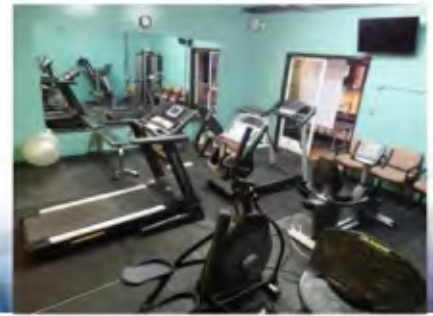
