Wednesday, February 14th, marks an important day in the church calendar. It is time to get your sweetheart some chocolate and red roses. Actually, I am not referring to Valentine's Day. Instead, next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *Lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus

on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

I, for one, am excited about this season of Lent. On Sundays during Lent, I will be preaching on images of the Crucifixion of Jesus found in the Scriptures. We believe that Jesus died for our sins. What does that mean? How are we supposed to interpret the cruel and agonizing death of Christ? The New Testament Scriptures enlighten us on our quest to figure out exactly what Christ's death means for us and for the entire world. As we will see in the coming weeks, the Passion of the Christ reveals themes of justice, sacrifice, victory, and unconditional love. All of these themes have huge ramifications for us. I look forward to seeing you and discussing the cross of Jesus in the upcoming weeks.
