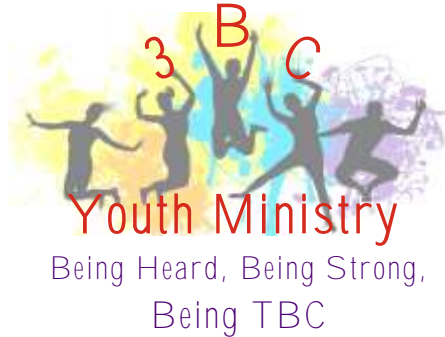

Exciting things are happening this summer around TBC's property! You may have already noticed that the lights in the gym have been replaced with high efficiency units that are not only brighter, but also use less electricity. The Church has also approved the implementation of an overhaul of our current security systems. In the coming months, we will be installing a door-monitoring system that will control access to the atrium. Visitors will utilize a door buzzer that allows church personnel to see and communicate with them prior to unlocking the door. Additionally, we will be replacing and upgrading the cameras located in the CLC to provide better quality video and coverage. This system will also allow real-time monitoring from the control room.

In order to fully utilize the new security measures, as well as providing several new opportunities for various ministries, we will have to upgrade our wireless internet connections. We are in the process of obtaining quotes for the installation of new wireless access points throughout the Church that will provide faster, more reliable connections and expand coverage areas.

Stay tuned for more information on other projects including acquiring a new van, revamping the landscaping, and more!
