A word from the heart

Spring is on the horizon. I know it is hard to believe given the current reading of the thermometer and costly energy bills. The new season's arrival brings about many changes in warmth, color, and the need to perform the yearly tasks associated with "spring cleaning!" Yardwork becomes a priority again. Windows need to be scrubbed, siding needs to be pressure washed, and garages need to be decluttered. We perform these tasks, not because they are fun, but because they are necessary. As good hosts, we want our homes looking nice. We desire to create an atmosphere that is accommodating to family and friends who might pay us a visit. As we learn, it takes effort to make our homes hospitable.

I believe that the church needs to prioritize hospitality in the

same way we do in our homes. To put it bluntly, churches that do not have guests who become recurring attendees are churches that decline. Another reality is that we only have one opportunity to make a good first impression, which means that we must make hospitality a high priority. While greeting guests with a friendly smile and a handshake are important, they are not the only elements of hospitality. Our church desperately needs to look at our facilities and ask this question, "Does this make a guest feel welcome?" The Youth Support Group completed and submitted a grant proposal to help in their work to support each other and end bullying. The Youth made several flower arrangements and cards a few weeks ago, and we delivered them to Hermitage Nursing Home this past Sunday. We collected several items for the Owensboro Humane Society (thank you for your donations!), and hope to deliver them soon. We're completing our study on *One*, which focuses on revival and self-reflection. It's been a great Bible study, and the resources will be available in the Library (movie, lesson video, teacher's guide, and participant's guide), if anyone wants to do a small group study. Finally, some of the Youth have

started cleaning and organizing the basement area. It's great to see them putting their energy and ideas to work!

By the end of the semester, we hope to have received the grant and have met with at least one school about instituting a comprehensive anti-bullying program. We also hope to plant some flowers where our electronic sign used to live, and several of the Youth hope to attend Extreme Build this summer. Our next lesson will be based on the book *Nobody Cries When You Die*, which details a young Latino's struggle to hear God's call to vocation in a life of abuse, poverty, gangs, drugs, and racism. According to the author, sometimes our vocation is simply to live. I'm thankful that so many of us don't have to face such struggles, and I'm also thankful for the church's dedication to helping our Youth survive their world of abuse, poverty, gangs, drugs, and racism. You truly bless others by providing a space and resources for them to be safe and grow.

1. **Singing helps us remember words.** Think of the number of songs you can recite. Music helps us remember.
2. **Singing encourages one another.** Seeing other believers, singing praise to God, encourages me & strengthens my faith. I know what they're singing about has changed their lives, literally, and forever!
3. **Singing connects God's truth to us emotionally.** It's not only about the lyrics. If it were, God would have told us to "speak praise to Him." He wants us to emotionally connect with these truths of His. Could this be because we are more likely to act
4. **Singing is healthy.** There are many scientific studies that have found links between singing and good health. When we sing, especially in a group setting, endorphins are released, anxiety and stress levels go down, and more oxygen is pumped through the bloodstream. We feel better, and are truly healthier.

However, we give praise to all kinds of stuff, every day - restaurants, cars, movies, computes, songs - shouldn't 'Almighty God who created everything there is' be at the top of that list?
