FROM THE PASTOR

Last month, I did something I haven't done in decades – like, maybe four of them: I had a bowl of Cocoa Krispies!

The context: I was invited to join our NPPC youth at a lock-in at the church to work on plans for Youth Sunday coming up on February 11th. And at 10:30 on Friday night, Hayley Lynn, one of the youth leaders, provided a "cereal bar" for a snack – because there's nothing better than a bowl of cereal with really

cold milk late at night, right? I had forgotten just how many versions of sugared cereals there are. We had Frosted Flakes, Honey Nut Cheerios, Lucky Charms, Frosted Mini-Wheats, Cinnamon Toast Crunch, and Raisin Bran (for the health conscious). And, of course, Cocoa Krispies, which were my childhood favorite.

And let me tell you, after all those

years, they tasted every bit as good as I remembered. All that chocolate yumminess mixes with the milk so you feel like you're eating Rice Krispies (healthy) but with chocolate milk (an almost illicit surprise which your parents would never allow in any other situation.)

As I saw all those boxes of cereal lined up on the table, I was reminded of a presentation Anne McKee does during orientation at Maryville College. Anne, you know, is the college chaplain, and she is tasked with talking to incoming students about the value of faith and learning at MC. As the college's statement of purpose says, we have to "listen attentively and humbly to the voice of God no matter how God may speak." As a part of that conversation, Anne shows them a picture of grocery store shelves that have no less than 3 dozen different kinds of cereal that cover the whole range of healthy to sugary-sweet.

The point is obvious – all those different kinds of cereal serve roughly the same function, but they all do it a little differently. You like little marshmallows in your cereal? Great.

Lucky Charms is for you. You want to spell out floating words in your spoon? Try Alpha-Bits. Want something a little healthier with an old-school feel? Cheerios are for you.

If Presbyterians were a cereal, what kind of cereal would we be? Shredded Wheat, which you don't really like, but feel sort of virtuous for eating? All Bran, which tastes (to me) like processed cardboard? Or would we be some kind of granola, full of fruits, nuts and flakes?

Last night at our session meeting, we examined the new officers who will help to lead this church for the next three years. They are an outstanding group of women and men that this congregation (through its nominating committee) has identified as people whom we want to follow. We also said goodbye to the faithful elders who will roll

off the session next month, and gave thanks for them and their ministries.

I always invite those elders to say a few personal words to their colleagues, which is touching and meaningful. And, as you might expect, we get all the usual jokes about how they've been committee-ed to near death over the last three years.

But I hope that our denomination is known for something more than just committees and process and doing things "decently and in order." I'd like to think of Presbyterians as Cocoa Krispies – underneath, we are as stable and reliable as Rice Krispies. But maybe we could be known for sweet kindness, too – a little bit of a surprise to go along with the traditional snap, crackle, and pop.

Despite all the "frozen chosen" jokes, I'm happy to be Presbyterian, and I'm glad you are too. So maybe this is the year that we can show the world all of what that name really means.

It is a joy to be the church with you!

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN NEWS

December 31, 2017, marked the end of our third three-year commitment Capital Campaign. Our building loan started in January 2011, with a loan amount of \$3,068,260.67. As of this month, we have paid over half the mortgage with a current balance of \$1,411,931.01. Thank you for your generosity and devotion to New Providence and its ministries! Although the official Capital Campaign ended at the end of 2017, we still have way to go. Check your end of year contribution statement for your pledge balance, and if you didn't pledge, you can contribute anyway. We have continued to receive gifts to the building fund through new members, memorial contributions, and our congregation continuing to give even beyond their original pledge. Because of these gifts, we have not had to run our mortgage payment through our operating budget. In fact, we currently have a two year reserve fund to make our payments. Our loan interest rate is fixed until March 2020 when we will almost certainly be in a higher interest rate environment based on the Federal Reserve's most recent rate hikes, and what they anticipate in 2018 and 2019. Your aifts to our building fund assure that the church will continue to allocate its resources to ministry, not interest payments. Thank you for what you have given, and please prayerfully consider continuing your gifts to our building fund.

LIFT UPDATE

Let's Inspire Families Together, better known as LIFT, is an outreach of New Providence that started in Fall 2015. Since its inception, LIFT partners volunteers from our congregation with Kindergarten through third-grade students at Lanier Elementary twice weekly. The students and volunteers forge relationships that provide students with sound foundational skills to support them as emerging readers. While this may sound technical and rather complicated, it's not at all. These interactions involve reading to and reading with students, having conversations fostering vocabulary acquisition and language skills, playing games such as memory or Go Fish to develop social skills.

Paired with volunteer participation, NPPC also provides a warm meal lovingly planned and prepared by our Welcome Table. This meal not only meets a physical need for the families participating at Lanier but also provides a vehicle for relationship building. School personnel, volunteers, parents, grandparents, aunts, foster parents and students all break bread together and enjoy conversation.

This semester your LIFT volunteers and steering committee continue to do very important work on behalf of this church. Our work however is not on site at Lanier but more-so behind the scenes. For the next few weeks and months, LIFT will be reflecting and contemplating what this ministry is being called to do next, with opportunities to serve even more of our local elementary schools. The steering committee will keep the church informed as to how this ministry evolves (what students/families we will serve, how and where this will be). Thank you for your continued support of and blessings upon the LIFT program this congregation has so generously given.

SEVEN SPIRITUAL PRACTICES FOR THE NEW YEAR

- 7. Thankfulness comes in a variety of forms. Each day make a list of things you encounter for which you are thankful. At the end of the day, incorporate the list into a prayer.
