Greetings from the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee! As you know, last fall the congregation of New Providence authorized this committee to begin the search process for two new full-time Associate Pastors and one halftime Director of Care and Formation. The committee has been very actively pursuing our charge.

The process to call a minister in our denomination is deliberate and designed to help our committee and prospective candidates thoroughly consider many criteria related to a call to ministry. All these steps are undergirded with much prayer by those involved.

The PC(USA) has an office that helps candidates and churches "find" each other. The Church Leadership Connection has provided nearly 100 Personal Information Forms (resumes containing educational and career backgrounds as well as information about the candidates' call to ministry) to us. We also have received recommendations from presbyteries surrounding Presbytery of East Tennessee, seminaries that know of our Published monthly to keep friends and members informed of news and coming events

search and candidate recommendations from individuals. We have even had several candidates contact us directly when they learned of our search.

As a result, we have reviewed 115 Personal Information Forms, conducted over 40 phone/video conference interviews, met with some outstanding candidates and called many, many references.

It is our prayer that we will identify who God is calling to serve New Prov within the next few months. Your APNC is very thankful for the opportunity to serve New Providence and asks that you continue to pray for God to give us wisdom as we pursue our call.

FROM THE PASTOR

There are not enough words to describe my gratitude for the incredible gift of having served as your pastor for the last two

decades. I wish you all could have seen the images swimming around in my head on

July 14th at the lunch celebrating our twenty years of ministry together at New Providence. Every face draws up a special memory.

It seems like yesterday that I was sitting in Vera and Bill Proffitt's living room for an interview. That same weekend, the search committee took me to dinner at RJ's Courtyard, where John Keller served as a human shield to block the view of other church members who happened to be there at the same time. Antonieta Haralson drove me to the airport and convinced me that Maryville could be a welcoming place for a single person. Carl McDonald and Dick Ray arrived in my living room in Tampa to ask me to come serve as your pastor, and I barely blinked. This call felt absolutely right from the beginning, and it feels so to this day.

God has been at the center of this journey all along, and I continue to believe God leads us along the way.

Since the summer of 1999, we've done a few things together:

- We've re-aligned our governing and serving structures significantly at least twice, with a lot of smaller reorganizations along the way.
- We've started an alternative worship service, addressing the needs of members and friends looking for something different than traditional worship.
- We've added 17,000+ square feet of fellowship and educational space, which has expanded our outreach to the community in ways we never imagined.
- We've reached out to our neighbors via tutoring programs, housing for people experiencing homelessness,

and respite for those caring for adults with special needs.

And for the last 11 years, we've fed 12 or 13 thousand meals a year through the

Welcome Table.

I wouldn't begin to claim credit for any of that, but I am blessed

and honored to have been a part of the ways this congregation has found to love God and neighbor over the last 233 years, and especially for the last twenty.

It has been an incredible time, and I am grateful for all of you who have participated in that, and for all the ways we have been able to celebrate that.

But grateful as I am for what has happened in the past, I am even more excited about what lies ahead. We are not about to rest on our laurels – it is time to look to the future.

Here's what I see:

It is a joy to be the

church with you!

- In the next few months, we will welcome two new associate pastors to lead our ministries with children and youth, as well as focus our connectional and outreach ministries.
- We look forward to filling a new staff position to oversee our ministries of pastoral care and adult discipleship.
- Within the next few years, I see us completing the final phases of our building plan: paying off our mortgage, plus a complete renovation of the current administrative and educational wings, as well as covered access to the sanctuary and other parts of the building.

In addition to, and maybe more importantly, I hope we can figure out together what it means to be the church in the 21st century. Gone are the days when we can expect people to show up just because it's Sunday morning and we're the big church on the hill. Instead we will be asking, what will it look like for us to take the love of Christ to people outside our

walls? How do we become a more diverse congregation, both racially and socioeconomically? What does welcome look like? How will we embrace change? What does the gospel call us to do and be in this next chapter of our lives together?

Those are the questions I'm eager for us to engage together. I happen to believe that NPPC's best days are ahead of us. I look forward to opportunities to dig into those issues, to hearing the new and innovative ideas that will bring about new life.

Most of all, I hope you'll join in the process.

CARING THROUGH PRAYER

On Sunday, July 28, 2019, Emily preached on Luke 11: 2-13 and offered us the concept that we learn how to pray by praying. Prayer is an important aspect of our walk with God it is truly how spiritual communications take place. Through prayer God speaks to us and through prayer we speak to God.

James also teaches us that we can live in a beloved community and provide pastoral care through prayer. In the text he references Elijah and points out that his prayers were effective (powerful) not because he was a prophet but because he was human, an individual who believed in the power of God. The idea is that his prayers were passionate and what was asked of God, God did. This is a tremendous model for those who are suffering in any capacity, for it presents an idea that there is no limit to the power of prayer. Some believe that prayer is "nothing less than contacting the power of God." And what more could be asked of God in bringing grace to the troubles and problems of our lives.

A recommendation was made from work carried out by the deacons to form a prayer group that would pray for the concerns of our congregation, our community and the world.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

Historically, New Providence has conducted a spring stewardship campaign asking members of the congregation to make a pledge that indicates their anticipated annual giving. We then take those numbers into the budgeting cycle to match income to expenses.

This year we want to do things differently. After much study and discussion, the NPPC session has decided to modify the process by moving our stewardship drive to the fall, while maintaining a July to June budget year.

We have several reasons for a shift:

- calendar year giving simplifies reporting for members;
- stewardship is about responding to God, not a budget; and
- we have every reason to believe that NPPC members will continue to faithfully step up to meet the financial needs for our congregation's mission and ministries.

This will be a transitional year into the new process. The 2019-20 budget will be generated and go into effect July 1, 2019, before pledges are received in Fall 2019. <u>During this</u> <u>transition time, we are asking each of</u> <u>you to continue giving at least at your</u> <u>current level, if not greater.</u>

HEALTH TIPS

SHINING A LIGHT ON SUNSCREEN

In recent years, skin cancer has been on the rise, and it has become more important for us to protect our bodies from the sun's harmful rays. But how much do you know about sunscreen and sun protection? While the use of sunscreen on exposed skin as protection is common knowledge, the details sometimes get fuzzy. Learn more about how to protect your skin, and share what you learn with others!

- The sun's rays include ultraviolet A (UVA) and ultraviolet B (UVB) rays. Sunscreen Sun Protection Factor (SPF) measures the lotion's ability to block UVB rays only. To make sure your sunscreen blocks UVA rays, as well, look for the words "broad spectrum" on your lotion bottle.
- Sunscreens with zinc oxide are recommended because they block both UVA and UVB rays.
- Seek shade where available. The sun's rays are usually strongest between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- Water and sand both reflect the sun's damaging rays, so use extra caution when out at the beach.
- An SPF number does not constitute how many minutes you can be out in the sun. The number designates the length of time you can be out in the sun before you get sunburned. For example, an SPF of 30 means you can be out in the sun 30 times longer than if you had no sunscreen on without getting burned.
- For the sunscreen to be effective, you need to use an ounce for exposed areas.
- Use sunscreen every day you are outside, year round. Even on cloudy days, the sun's rays can pierce clouds with up to 80% efficacy.
- Typically, an adult should use a water-resistant, broad spectrum, SPF 30 or higher sunscreen and reapply every two hours or so.


