# WELCOME

WORSHIP NOTES  
FROM THE PASTOR



What a story Jesus gives us this morning in the gospel lectionary text! It is so far-fetched that it's hard for us to imagine ourselves in this parable, but at the same time it's so familiar that it makes us very uncomfortable. Like so much of this section of Luke's gospel, Jesus is focusing on material possessions and asking impertinent questions about how we earn and spend our income. As I said last week, I'm not sure that the money is the issue as much as it is our relationship to money. And that, in turn, affects how we treat one another.

This morning we also introduce the 8 children who have been a part of our Welcome to Worship class this fall. For the last 8 weeks, they and their parents have met with *Hayley Lynn* to learn about what we do in worship and why. This is their preparation for being in "big church" throughout the service, so I hope you will do everything you can to introduce yourself to them and make them feel welcome. Those children are: *Emily Beard*, daughter of *Kayla & Jimmy Beard*; *Clara Bradford*, daughter of *Elizabeth & Nick Bradford*; *Maggie Conatser*, daughter of *Eliza & Judd Conatser*; *Neil Hardy*, son of *Jenn & Claude Hardy*; *Boone Kilday*, son of *Arielle & Bryan Kilday*; *George Long*, son of *Maxey & Forrest Long*; *Caroline Long*, daughter of *Maxey & Forrest Long*; & *Grant Overton*, son of *Jewell & Eric Overton*.

At the FirstLight service, we'll sing Joel Houston's "From the Inside Out," written when he was a young adult and a pastor's kid. "That song is probably the hardest song I've ever had to write, because it's the essence of gaining a revelation of who Christ is and what it means to be a follower. I feel like when I look at the lyrics of that song, it's me unpacking everything I knew to be true about God at that period of my life. Whose faith do I accept? What do I truly believe?"

The text of "The God of Abraham Praise" was written by Moses Maimonides, a medieval Jewish philosopher and one of the most prolific and influential Torah scholars of the Middle Ages. This hymn is part of a Jewish creedal doxology still sung during the weekly Sabbath eve service in some traditions. The LEONI tune is a Hebrew synagogue melody, also called YIGDAL after the original Hebrew name.

"When a Poor One" is a much newer hymn that comes to us from Spain; J.A. Olivar and Miguel Manzano wrote both the lyrics and the EL CAMINO tune. They set out to paraphrase Jesus' parable of the great judgment from Matthew 25:31-46 ("the least of these brothers and sisters of mine...") Both Olivar and Manzano are former priests from Madrid. Since Vatican II, they have collaborated on many hymns for Spanish singing congregations.

"God of Grace and God of Glory" is a prayer for God's help for the church to live in God's power and love with generosity and progress toward social justice. It was written by well-known and often controversial preacher Harry Emerson Fosdick for the opening service of Riverside Church in NYC. May this be our prayer this week: "Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, for the living of these days."
